# GMPA SUMMARY ACTIVITY REPORT 2022

#### **About GMPA**

Global Migration Policy Associates is a unique network among migration-concerned experts in all regions of the world. The member Associates and Affiliates reflect diverse academic and practical disciplines addressing multiple aspects and impacts of international migration. GMPA is a vital space and place for ongoing rights-based, multidisciplinary, participative research, policy development, advisory services, training-teaching, and knowledge- and values-based advocacy. It generates, encourages and supports knowledge and analysis for a broad international articulation, promotion and realization of the rights-based approach. It articulates alternatives to the instrumental cost-benefit logic of harnessing migration and 'migration management' predominant today. To make a difference, GMPA conducts research and develops analysis and policy directions independently while supporting partner activities.

#### In 2022

GMPA activity focused on knowledge-building and policy-development support with publication of a joint special issue on global migration of the RTE peer-reviewed academic-scientific journal, preparing migration profiles of Eurasian countries, serving as shadow rapporteur and scribe for a global parliamentary conference, conducting trainings on labour migration at ITC-ILO in Turin and on human rights and labour standards in Uganda, other trainings in Asia and Africa focused on Bilateral Labour Agreements (BLAs), presenting an expert paper at a conference on Eurasian regional migration, initial preparation of a migration governance manual for Southern Africa countries, and conducting ongoing research on multiple topics. GMPA expects to expand attention in 2023 to *gender dimensions* and to environmental degradation and migration with new expert members specialized in these arenas.

#### **Effect and Impact**

The impact of GMPA activity and publications in 2022 included making significant contributions to:

- Building the global knowledge base on international migration and rights-based governance of migration.
- Elaborating tripartite constituent-oriented guidance including on negotiating and implementing
  "rights-based BLAs" –Bilateral Labour Agreements based on and appropriate for Africa, including in
  particular member countries of IGAD Intergovernmental Authority for Development comprising
  Horn of Africa and East Africa States as well as the African Union overall.
- Developing training and practical application materials for African and Asian countries' establishment and implementation of BLAs and other bilateral labour mobility instruments.
- Continuing to feature a standards and rights-based approach in these and other governance arenas, objectively contending with deregulatory utilitarian, non-normative narratives, policy models and guidance articulated by various international organizations and business interests.
- Assisting to shape outcomes of international conferences as well as law and policy guidance with proper reference to rule of (just) law and standards-based governance framing legislation, policy and practical responses to international migration challenges, towards assuring human and labour rights protections, social justice, and equality of treatment for all persons concerned --migrants and 'natives' alike-- in countries and regions worldwide.
- Providing direct practical training and user-friendly materials to government and social partner policy makers and actors as well as legislators worldwide, Africa and Asia in particular.

#### 3. National migration profiles: East Europe and Eurasia

A GMPA team compiled comprehensive national migration profiles as background for the ITUC *RecruitmentAdvisor* website on Moldova, Kazakhstan, Kyrghiz Republic, Russian Federation, Tajikistan, Turkey, Ukraine, and Uzbekistan. Content covered history highlights, migrant worker recruitment, conditions and challenges in countries of employment, statistical data, legislation on migration, ratification of international instruments, tips on avoiding abusive recruitment, etc. Team members were Denielle Amparado and Nicolas Centeno along with Patrick Taran and Olga Kadysheva.

To summarize 'what we did', activity by the Editorial team led by *Guest Editor* Patrick A. Taran and Journal *Editor in Chief* Nayeth Idalid Solórzano Alcivar included:

- developing the TOR-terms of reference for the special issue, in context of RTE specific ad general academic journal standards;
- identifying key topics on which to solicit articles;
- publicizing the call for papers/submissions and inviting articles via mass mailings and social networks:
- directly soliciting articles/papers from GMPA members, ESPOL and GSD students and other experts on specific migration topics;
- counselling intending authors on preparing and submitting articles according to academic journal standards;
- initial qualifying review of submissions;
- identifying peer reviewers and arranging and following-up peer review of each article;
- · assisting authors to understand and address peer review comments and concerns; and
- editorial check of revised submissions for RTE copy-editing, layout and publication.

The resulting published volume pulled together content concerning all world regions—Africa, the Americas, Asia, Europe, Eurasia, and Oceania. Authors and peer reviewers represent regional and national diversity across the globe; gender balance; multiple disciplines; and a range among authors/contributors from migrants to young women scholars to veteran international specialists to accomplished academics.

The ten rigorously peer reviewed articles covered:

- policy for rights, decent work and well-fare of women migrant workers;
- health and risks facing migrants and refugees in the COVID-19 pandemic;
- small island country mitigation and adaptation to global warming;
- impeding climate-change displacement of indigenous pastoralist communities;
- preventing discrimination and promoting equality of treatment;
- · common approaches of cities welcoming migrants and refugees; and
- the key role of international migration in sustaining economies, development, and human welfare worldwide.
- consequences of anti-migration discourse by populist ethno-nationalism,
- lessons from ancient history for contemporary international refugee law, and
- an innovative approach to including human rights and migration in university education.

## Feature Event 2: GMPA participation in IPU-GNAT global parliamentary conference

**Global Parliamentary Conference on refugees and migration**, **Istanbul**, 20-21 June 2022, organized by the **Inter-Parliamentary Union - IPU** and the **Grand National Assembly of Türkiye** (GNAT), was the first global parliamentary conference focusing on refugees and migration. Some 300 parliamentarians participated from nearly 50 countries, including 17 speakers of national parliaments. Officials of international, regional and national organizations attended, some were speakers on the packed programme over two days.

GMPA President **Patrick Taran** served as speaker, session moderator, and shadow rapporteur. The *rapporteur report* ( *English / French* ) presented by Joseph Osei-Owusu, First Deputy Speaker of the National Assembly of Ghana provides a comprehensive, rights-respecting and 'people-centered' global assessment and agenda for parliaments worldwide on matters of refugees, forced displacement, and migration broadly. GMPA Research Associate **Denielle Amparado** (Philippines) served as scribe for the conference, supporting preparation of the Rapporteur's summary.

Over the two day conference, parliamentarians from all regions --Africa, Asia, Europe, Eurasia, the Middle East, and North and South America-- shared situations their countries face, debated how to address causes of compelled migration, called for cooperation and responsibility-sharing, and urged adoption and implementation of binding international instruments on governance of migration, notably the International Convention on the Protection of the Rights of All Migrant Workers and Members of Their Families (ICRMW). The Global Compact on Refugees and the Global Compact on Migration and their implementation were also a focus of discussion.

# Feature Activities 3: Participation in international training events

ILO Better Regional Migration Management Project, Addis Ababa: Training on Bilateral Labour Agreements for the Protection of Kenyan Migrant workers, Mombasa, Kenya, 17-19 March 2022

The above course was organized by the ILO to build the capacity of member of the Kenyan Tripartite committee on BLAs. In organizing this training, Piyasiri Wicramasekara participated online as a lead resource person. He made presentations on the following and interacted with the participats on question-and-answer sessions.

# Training modules on bilateral labour migration instruments (BLMIs) for capacity building of government officials: Bangladesh, March-May 2022.

Prepared under under the ILO-SDC Project: "Application of Migration Policy for Decent Work for Migrant Workers: Phase II.

10 Powerpoint modules on BLMI related issues were prepared by Dr. Wickramasekara; these were accompanied by related handouts and an electronic library of relevant references on BLMIs. He was assisted by a local consultant, Mr. Asif Munier, in this task.

**ITCILO**, **E-Course on Developing**, **Negotiating and Implementing Bilateral Labour Agreements**, 13 June 2022 – 22 July 2022. Piyasiri Wickramasekara was a lead trainer and delivered Prepared *power-point* presentations and delivered presentations on Evaluation and Monitoring of BLAs and Challenges Related to Implementation of BLAs followed by questions and answers. He technically backstopped and provided feedback on two sessions on 16 and 21 June 2022. He also commented and provided detailed clarifications to weekly forum contributions by the participants. He also acted as a resource person for the final group work session on the simulation exercise of the negotiation of a BLA (21 July 2022).

He provided technical support in the revision of the training toolkit on Bilateral Labour Migration Instruments used for the online course and elective course on BLAs by updating the content of the modules to contemporary scenarios and compiling a comprehensive glossary.

ITC-ILO-IGAD Training on Protection of migrant workers and their families in and from the IGAD region countries, Entebbe, Uganda, 22-26 August 2022, organized by the International Training Center of the ILO (ITC ILO) and Intergovernmental Authority for Development (IGAD).

The event was organized by the ITC ILO (International Training Center of the ILO at Turin) as part of an ongoing Diploma Course for IGAD member-country migration focal points, it was held under auspices of the ILO-IGAD <u>Free Movement of Persons and Transhumance in the IGAD Region</u> project supported by the EU.



#### Feature Event consequent to GMPA work:

The African Union Guidelines on Bilateral Labour Agreements were adopted by the African Union Specialised Technical Committee (STC) on Social Development, Labour and Employment, at its session 4-8 April 2022 in Addis Ababa. Background research and drafting of the Guidelines were conducted in 2021 by a GMPA expert specialist team comprising Patrick Taran, Piyasiri Wickramasekara, and Marius Olivier, assisted by Olga Kadysheva and Hiral Hirani. The draft Guidelines were reviewed and vetted for submission to the AU-STC by a formal AU Validation Meeting on 22 July 2021 involving tripartite delegates from 30 member countries reflecting all regions of the continent.

The STC adoption foreseen in 2021 was deferred to 2022 due to the ongoing pandemic situation.

## **GMPA OPERATIONAL ACTIVITY 2022**

GMPA conducts its activity with financial and other resources from modest member dues and project funding for research, advisory, and training activities. GMPA is a strictly non-commercial non-profit organization, registered with the State & Canton of Geneva since 2012 in accord with provisions of the Swiss Civil Code. GMPA has UN ECOSOC NGO Consultative Status since 2015. GMPA engages in implementation agreements with international organizations and other tax-exempt entities. The association does not conduct commercial activity nor engage in contractual arrangements of a commercial nature.

GMPA has not received external grant funding to sustain core operations and administration, instead 'supporting itself' by *pro-bono* voluntary staff work by member Associates and *cooperants*. It functions independently of grant conditionalities, funder *agendas*, and funding cycles of international or national institutions, philanthropic foundations or governments.

GMPA maintains a small office at the historic 18<sup>th</sup> Century *Villa Masaryk* located adjacent to the *Place des Nations* across the Avenue de la Paix from the main entrance to the UN Palais des Nations in Geneva.
