2030 Global Agenda for Sepsis Making the Next Success Story in Global Health

Purpose

In line with 2030 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and the Fourteenth General Programme of Work (GPW 14) of the World Health Organization (WHO), the Side Event aims to catalyze transformative actions for saving 2 million lives from Sepsis by 2030 through stronger political leadership, health systems strengthening, R&D and more effective prevention and management of Sepsis during health emergencies.

Specifically, the event aims to consolidate political momentum for the 2030 Global Agenda for Sepsis launched by the Global Sepsis Alliance (GSA) at the German Parliament in September 2024 in partnership with the Global Health Sub-Committee of the German Bundestag, UNITE Parliamentarians Network for Global Health, Virchow Foundation and Sepsis Stiftung.

The Global Sepsis Alliance and its partners were honoured to receive a special video address from Dr. Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus – WHO Director-General for the occasion of the Agenda launch.

The 2030 Global Agenda for Sepsis is the 1st global strategy on how to reduce suffering of 48.9 million children, women, and men annually and improve health outcomes from Sepsis. It was elaborated through engagement of more than 70 stakeholders and Sepsis survivors from 6 geographic regions, including MWIA, CHAI, UNITE, Virchow Foundation and Sepsis Stiftung (Side Event co-organizers).

Engaging the governments of Guyana and Egypt, the Side Event will also encourage other UN Member States to join the High-Level Political Panel on Sepsis to be established in September 2025. The Panel will bring together Heads of State, Health Ministers, and Parliamentarians for positioning Sepsis higher in the global political agenda, including at G7/G20, UN, WHA, national and regional Parliaments, Ministerial summits, and other forums.

Relevance of the Side Event to the World Health Assembly

The side-event addresses the WHA78 agenda items 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, and 28 of the WHA78. However, while closely related to Maternal and Child Health, Infection Prevention and Control (IPC), Emergency, Critical and Operative Care (ECO), Universal Health Coverage (UHC), antimicrobial resistance (AMR) and other topics covered by WHA78 agenda, Sepsis is still not adequately visible in WHA discussions, compared to its massive human and economic burden.

Sepsis affects 48.9 million people annually, including 26.2 million women and 20.3 million under-5 children. Sepsis accounts for 20% of deaths worldwide, claiming lives of 2.9 million children and 5.1 million from NCDs and injuries. 78% of COVID-19 patients in ICUs had viral Sepsis and every future pandemic will increase the risk. Estimated 4.95 million AMR-related deaths annually are part of 13.66 million Sepsis-related deaths. Finally, over 360 million people in humanitarian crisis and displacement, due to climate- or man-made emergencies, are at increased risks of Sepsis.

The 2030 Global Agenda calls for national action plans and policies to integrate Sepsis into primary health care, emergency, critical and operative care (ECO), Universal Health Coverage (UHC) packages, and emergency response plans. Sepsis policies must be also aligned with patient safety, infection prevention and control (IPC), AMR and other priorities.

The Side Event will ensure better visibility of Sepsis, the major killer of children, women and men, and encourage stronger political momentum from UN Member States and multiple stakeholders, on how to attain the 2030 Global Agenda for Sepsis and avert millions of unnecessary deaths and disability, especially in low- and middle-income country contexts.

Expected Outcomes of the Meeting:

- Reaffirming that the 2030 SDGs and aspiring targets for Maternal, Newborn and Child Health, UHC, AMR, Pandemic or other emergency preparedness cannot be achieved without stronger Sepsis response at national, regional and global levels.
- Understanding the 5 Strategic Pillars of 2030 Global Agenda for Sepsis, how to reduce Sepsis incidence and mortality by > 20% in the next 5 years.
- Encouraging UN Member States to join the High-Level Political Panel for Sepsis to be launched on the World Sepsis Day September 13, 2025, and
- Learning about the Global Sepsis Innovations Platform (GSIP), World Sepsis Day (WSD) Movement and other initiatives, how different stakeholders can contribute to the success of the 2030 Global Agenda for Sepsis.
